Symptoms & Risks

SYMPTOMS

- Difficulty swallowing
- Strained voice
- Heartburn
- Unexplained weight loss
- Unexplained tiredness
- Vomiting
- Cough
- Black or blood in stool

RISKS

- High alcohol consumption
- Smoking tobacco
- Diet low in fresh fruit and vegetables
- Obesity
- Exposure to certain chemical fumes
- Family history of gastrointestinal disorders
- Medical conditions such as Barrett's oesophagus, gastro-oesophageal reflux disease (GORD) or achalasia
